March Meeting

Saturday, March 12 @ 10am

The March meeting will take place in Casa del Prado, room 104 in Balboa Park and will also be live on Zoom. The Zoom invitation was sent via email.

This month we remain in San Diego with our speakers Morlane, Scott and Eloise. They will be telling us how to grow and use bromeliads in our gardens and home collections. There will be three short talks about the genera Neoregelia, Billbergia and Fosterella. The format will be open (specimens to show and/or images to view) and questions will be welcome after they speak. Expect some background about the plants they're dealing with (where they come from, for whom they are named, how to recognize, grow and enjoy them). So, whether you're an expert or a beginner, come with questions in mind!

Morlane O'Donnell grows a wide collection of bromeliads and will describe how she selects and grows billbergias. Scott Sandel, an avid enthusiast for neoregelias, will show us and talk about some favorites, especially among the modern hybrids. Eloise Lau, with a wide interest in bromeliads, will tell us about fosterellas and how they can be planted among other bromeliads to complement them.

March Plant Table

For the March plant table and auction, we have a wide selection of plants. This month our opportunity plants come from two sources. Plants from Michael's Bromeliads intentionally include a

wide range of genera, including Aechmea, Alcantarea, Cryptanthus, Orthophytum, xSincoregelia, and a few other odds and ends. These pups will be ready to hit some fresh potting soil, so hear up for them.

February Recap

The February meeting featured 2 speakers and lots of interesting plants. However, the Zoom broadcast did not work this time due to technical difficulties. Apologies to all who tried to join in from home. There are a few complexities in properly executing the broadcast, but it looks like the Zoom will work in March.

The first part of the program was a travelogue by Juliana Raposo, reporting on a recent trip to Brazil. The talk focused on Alcantareas in Rio de Janeiro and a few important local bromeliad collections there.

Dave Kennedy presented the second part of the program, with a hands-on demonstration on tillandsias that can be successfully grown in San Diego.

For Show and Tell, Scott Sandel went with the theme and brought 2 mighty alcantareas to the meeting. Alc. Florys (top photo) and Alc. Aurora (center left). Both are cultivars of Alcantarea glaziouana with unique variegation patterns. Hauling the huge plants to Balboa Park was no joke!

Other contributions to Show and Tell include Lucia Velasquez with Aechmea weilbachii, Al Evans with Tillandsia albertiana mounted on a rock, Bob Vitacco and Tillandsia recurvata, Robert Kopfstein with Vriecantarea Inferno (center right), Nancy Groves with Tillandsia latifolia var leucophylla, Tillandsia purpurea 'Shooting Star', and Don Nelson who brought Quesnelia testudo and Billbergia nutans.

Tillandsia stricta

At this time of the year, the humble Tillandsia stricta flowers brighten the gardens of SoCal bromeliad growers and delight local hummingbirds. I enjoy my morning coffee these days while looking at blooming T. stricta ball in my back patio.

In the southern hemisphere, T. stricta is also blooming in habitat. Bromeliad expert and nurseryman <u>Pedro Nahoum posted on the BSI</u> <u>Facebook group</u>:

"Tillandsia stricta is a very well adapted species to the environment of the Restinga vegetation, the sandy ecosystem of the lowlands near to the Atlantic Ocean in Brazil The images of this blooming season on the end of the summer shows T. stricta specimens growing epiphytically and also on the litter that covers the sandy soil under the native shrubs. We can find much more plants of T. stricta on the Restinga soil than on the trees rooted on the litter's dead leaves they reach the biggest sizes already registered for the species, with some individuals measuring 1 foot (30 cm) in diameter

T. stricta volunteers at random in urban areas in Rio de Janeiro. It is a very adaptable plant. I found it fascinating that these tiny tillies will also grow terrestrially in nature when given a chance, and in the restinga example, do better on the ground than perched.


In the Garden

There are two pictures of Billbergia 'Smokestack', a Lisa Vinzant hybrid. I love Smokestack for the bold red bracts and for its black foliage with silver scurfy banding on the reverse side of the leaves. The images are at two phases - one as a big fat "bud" and the other just as the first deep purple-blue flowers open.

New SDBS Treasurer Needed

The San Diego Bromeliad Society is in search of a new treasurer to replace the current treasurer. The starting date would be in January of 2023 to allow time for the new treasurer to transition. The position involves:

- Filing and paying quarterly sales tax (easy using Quicken software)
- Provide credit card capability at meetings and the annual show and sale
- Handling sales, raffle and auction money at meetings and the annual show and sale
- Depositing membership dues payments and notifying the membership chairman
- Writing occasional checks to reimburse members for supplies, pay speakers, plant purchases, etc.
- Checking the SDBS PO Box weekly.

The prospective treasurer should be somewhat familiar with a financial software program such as Quicken but it isn't required. It would also be nice to have a smart phone with a data plan although not necessary. (The personal data usage for SDBS business is minimal). I have spent the last few years putting together a checklist of items to be completed each month with appropriate website addresses, usernames, passwords and any other information required for each report. That sounds complex but in reality, there are only a couple of months that require some time - November and July. As a board member, you are entitled to attend board meetings, currently held every other month by Zoom.


